Sheriff, author of the *Encyclopedic Dictionary of Exploration Geophysics* and renowned Professor Emeritus at the University of Houston, has a passion for bringing graduate students outside the U.S. into the States to study geophysics at the University of Houston. Robert and his wife, Margaret, have generously contributed enough funds to your Foundation to endow two separate scholarships – providing annual awards of \$14,000 each.

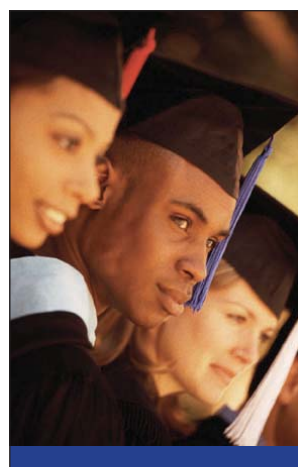
In their travels around the world, Robert and Margaret have met many bright young people who desire to further their studies in the field of geophysics. Unfortunately, many of those talented students had little hope of reaching such goals due to financial constraints. Dr. and Mrs. Sheriff founded these wonderful scholarship opportunities to help students like these and to give back to the science that has meant so much to them.

The purpose of the Sheriff Scholarships is to give non-U.S. students, who wish to pursue a M.S. or Ph.D. in Geophysics, a head start in their journey. The scholarships will provide recipients with sufficient financial support for the first year of study, including costs of tuition, fees, and living expenses. The Sheriffs are very pleased with past recipients of their scholarships, whom (as anticipated) have gone on to find ample opportunities to continue their graduate programs.

Non-U.S. students, pursuing M.S. or Ph.D. degrees in Geophysics at the University of Houston, are eligible to apply and may do so by simply completing the standard SEG Scholarship Application form available on the Foundation's web site (foundation.seg.org). Please note that the SEG Foundation and the University of Houston are not affiliated. Therefore, interested students should direct all admissions or other university-related inquiries to the Department of Geosciences at the University of Houston.

Symposium Boosts Students' Leadership Skills

SEG and Chevron Open New Doors for World's Top Geoscience Students

San Antonio bore witness to the inaugural launch of the new SEG/Chevron Student Leadership Symposium. Forty-one of the world's brightest geoscience students came together for an event that was described by some as "life changing" and "one of the most important moments of my life." Today, these are SEG's student leaders. Tomorrow, they will be your industry leaders.

Cezar Iacob, from the University of Bucharest Geophysical Society, was among the first talented students who attended this event. His excitement and enthusiasm about the symposium was both obvious and contagious. So we asked Cezar to share his experience with you as well.

"Each of us has leadership ambitions at some point in our life. But, according to leadership consultant Clint Swindall, only 19 % of all people are actually engaged in this kind of action. But for the engaged ones, who can explain the moment when they really started to lead something serious and how important that moment is for them?

For me, everything started during faculty times when, after many smaller attempts in high school, I finally started to lead a group of people doing serious things – the kinds of things that bring responsibilities with them. I was the leader of a student organization. Though we managed to do great things, the way I was leading my group was based upon the best direction that I had seen so far. As a leader, if you don't get to see the best way, then you won't be able to lead your people on the right path. Chevron Corporation and the SEG Foundation managed to see that and decided that it's time for a change. It's time to lend a hand to emerging leaders that are trying to improve things among students.

I was at the SEG Annual Meeting in New Orleans last year and I was just about to finish my poster presentation, when the voice of Peter Pangman resounded loudly throughout the entire exhibition hall. He was announcing, among other things, that Chevron Corporation had committed to sponsor the SEG Foundation in the incredible amount of \$1,000,000 for a program called the SEG/Chevron Student Leadership Symposium. At that moment, I knew I wanted to be a part of it; so I applied...

It all began on the morning of 22 September with registration... After an opening welcome session by Gary Servos [Foundation Chair] and Candice Chinesethagid [Student Affairs Supervisor], four students presented some of the achievements of their student sections. I was



also among them, presenting our collaboration with the Stanford University Student Section. It was very educating to share my experience and also learn from other students' experiences... Clint Swindall, leadership consultant and a very good speaker, held an interactive presentation about what leadership means, what the difference is between leaders and everyone else, and how one can be a better leader. After this session, each of us received a copy of Clint's book to improve our skills at home.

At lunchtime, we were divided into groups. Each group was composed of SLS students and SEG Executive Committee members or SEG Senior Staff. The same groups that ate together were then invited to attend a strategic problem solving session, where students had the opportunity to discuss with Executive Committee members actual problems that concern both SEG and the student sections. It was a great and useful experience to voice our thoughts and opinions in front of the right people and to see other aspects of those issues voiced by other students as well...

The second day's program started at 11:00 AM with lunch at Hard Rock Café... The organizers arranged a team building activity called Adventure Alliance Scavenger Hunt... It wasn't too difficult, but we had a lot of fun and we got much closer to one another... During the next three days, all of the activities that we were to be involved in were related to the SEG Annual Meeting where, by the way, registration fees were paid for by the SEG Foundation.

In conclusion, all that I can say is that I saw a lot of new perspectives, I learned a lot of things, I met wonderful people, I lived dream moments, I had a lot of fun, I made great friends, and new gates for new opportunities were opened for me. I'm just glad that Chevron and the SEG Foundation took a leadership role and created a change that I was a part of."

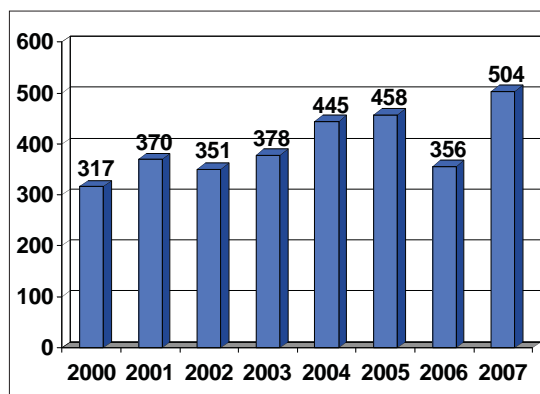
